

Goats – As you may have noticed the goats came back and are once again grazing the LCPOA properties as of mid-August. We understand that residents like to watch the goats but please keep your distance from the electric fences and the guard dogs.

Gate – When going through the resident lane please make sure your barcode scans. You will know you scanned through the gate when you are given a green light. Over the past several months we have had several incidents at the gate. Give yourself plenty of room between you and the vehicle in front of you. When the vehicle in front of you goes past the rock pillars, sensors will tell the arm to close. When your barcode scans the gate arm will rise and the green light comes on to let you know you are clear to pass. If you see the arm coming down or the light changing to red, please stop. Do not try to speed through the arm. Residents will need to pay for damage to the arm or gate system when this happens. Gate Arms are around \$1,500 apiece. Service calls can cost hundreds of dollars. Our video camera's pick up license plates and several angles, so we will know who is at fault if damage occurs.

Paving – This year's project is estimated to start on September 7^{th} . Please see inside the newsletter for the tentative schedule.

Pool – Hours for the pool will be changing due to attendants being back in school. After Labor Day Weekend the pool will be open from 7:00 AM – 10:00 AM for adult swim and 10:00 AM to 2:30 PM Monday through Friday (without attendants- swim at your own risk). Weekends will remain from 10:00 AM to 8:00 PM through October 1st. Pool attendants have the discretion to close early if the pool is not being used in the evenings. Please make sure to be with your younger children at the pool. **Children under 14 must be accompanied by an adult.** Unfortunately, we have had some inappropriate behavior by children, and they have been asked to leave. Pool privileges may be removed for not following the pool rules.

2. Motion to approve bid for the Lake California Pavement Rehab Project, 2023. The project roads are Indian Creek, Red Rock Peak Place, and Riverview Drive (from Lake California Drive to Forest Glen). Bid #1 from Eagle Paving of \$670,369.10. Bid #2 from J.F. Shea of \$947,378. Bid #3 from JB Bostick of \$689,030.60. Six other companies were asked to bid but did not. Funding to come from the CFRA of which \$463,091.00 has been set aside.

	Due to having a difference of \$207,278.10 (increase in materials, trucking, labor, etc.) our road engineering company went back to Eagle Paving since they were the lowest bid and reconfigured the specifications which included 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches of overlay on the road and 2 inches on the shoulders instead of 3 inches (we have used 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ and 2 in the past). This was a major factor in a lower amended bid of \$557,758.50 from Eagle Paving. The remaining funds needed of \$94,667.50 will come from the Road Maintenance account 5322/7322 of which we have a balance of \$419,258.



Income Survey: The census has this community's Median Household Income recorded at an amount over the state Median. Prior to the last census, we were considered a disadvantaged community. I cannot stress enough the importance of verifying these numbers for future infrastructure funding opportunities from sources. Please pass the word in the community encouraging the residents to respond to the survey. If you are a landlord, please encourage your tenants to respond to the survey. Steps of the process are listed below:

- A letter of explanation will go out within the next month on our letterhead explaining the details of the survey and the agency that will conduct the survey.
- RCAC (Rural Community Assistance Corporation) will send the survey out the following week with a selfaddressed stamped envelope included for return mail.
- The survey will be returned to RCAC and all information is strictly confidential.
- If RCAC does not receive a large enough sample size back, they will send another letter and a duplicate survey.
- If they still do not receive enough responses, they will attempt to go door to door.
- Respondents are to be only <u>residents</u> of the property, <u>not non-resident owners</u>.
- It is very important that you respond to the questionnaire honestly and promptly.

Billing Updates: Billings for the period 5/3/23 through 7/3/23 were due in the office by August 7, 2023 to avoid delinquent charges. Delinquent water bills for the period 5/3/23 through 7/3/23 will be subject to 24 hour notices on October 9, 2023 and those that remain unpaid will be locked off for non-payment on October 10, 2023. New billings for the period 7/3/23 through 9/3/23 will be mailed on September 5th and will be due on or before October 11, 2023, to avoid delinquent charges. Quarterly lot billings for period 06/30/23 through 9/30/23 will be mailed out on September 29, 2023 and need to be paid by November 7, 2023 to avoid delinquent charges. Payments can be made by check or cash, and credit card payments can be made on our website at <u>www.RAWD.org</u>. If paying in person remember to bring your billing stub with you for quick and accurate posting to your account. <u>If you pay using auto bill pay through your bank, be advised that they</u> <u>issue a check to Rio Alto which can take over 10 days to be received by the District. With this in mind, please allow adequate days to avoid a delinquent charge</u>. Customers can also sign up for auto draft payments by completing the form found on our website or at the District office. This service is free and will ensure payment is received before delinquent charges are assessed.

Drought: As of August 21, 2023, our current season to date precipitation is 39.27 inches, which is 119% of the normal season to date of 33.02 inches. Shasta Lake is 32.33 feet from the crest. The August levels compare with the previous two years as follows:

Fill out an application before you buy.

If a project is started without an application, the POA Compliance Officer will record a photo and send an email to the property owner to fill out the form and submit the paperwork to the POA office. Fines can be assessed if this process is not completed in a timely manner. Filling out an application can be done by obtaining a copy from the POA office at 19999 Lake California Drive or online at lakecalifornia.net. The office number is (530) 347-7900.

Firewise sponsored a yard clean up project on Hayfork Place in August. Volunteers did an excellent job of working on the project. More information can be found on the Firewise newsletter article. Progress is being made in the community to mitigate fire exposure. We are NOT done yet, it is an ongoing process. Projects include moving bark away from structures, cleaning out gutters of leaves and debris, trimming trees of lower branches, mowing grass areas, removing fuels from canyons as well as the non-fossil fuel lawn mowers (aka goats and sheep).

It is extremely important to have a "go bag" ready in the event of an evacuation order. A go bag is a suitcase or duffel bag or sports equipment bag in which you place items you need if you are away from home. Items such as: Folders with legal information, birth certificate, passports, phone numbers etc. Medical information, doctors and pharmacy information. Small ice chest for temperature sensitive medicines. Animal carriers near food and water stations. Animals will sense your stress level and might run and hide. Some clothes and toothbrush and other personal items. This is a small list, so make your own list of items that you and your family need.

TREES are beautiful and serve several purposes. They absorb carbon, provide shade and refuge for many creatures. However, trees, power lines and strong winds are a deadly combination. So please, trim up your trees, remove trees that are dangerously close to power equipment and don't argue about maintenance and safety issues. It only takes one tree to destroy thousands of structures.

Thank you all in Lake California for working with the Architectural Committee and the POA in filling out applications for projects. Remember to send a copy of permits and final inspections when required by Tehama County Building Department. You are a valuable asset to our Lake California community and we all appreciate your efforts and contributions to a great place to live.

DID YOU KNOW:

The following article was taken from the Chico News and Review

According to the California Department of Food and Agriculture, Californians throw away approximately 6 million tons of food annually. This staggering number equates to 18% of all material that goes into California's landfills. With these types of numbers, the waste issue seems daunting, and residents may doubt their efforts could possibly make much difference, so why try? For answers, we turned to Susan McCurry Murphy, who has been the coordinator for the Tehama County Food Alliance for 10 years. A former high school teacher, she holds a B.S. in Dietetics Food Science and Nutrition, as well as a California State Teaching Credential in Chemistry and Life Science, and a Master's Degree in Public Administration. With her impressive resume and experience, Murphy has a plethora of advice on how reducing food waste in our households can be easy and fun—and has a huge impact. Simply stated, Californians can help stop the great waste, Murphy says, by adopting six practical habits: planning, shopping, cooking, storing, reusing and composting. Not only will these efforts help protect the life of our landfills and the environment, but it also saves us money. (Experts estimate the average family wastes \$1,500 a year on food that goes uneaten.)

Planning—Make lists of the weekly meals made at home, make a grocery list of items needed.

Shopping—Select foods that do not go bad quickly.

Cooking—Plan for leftovers when prepping and cooking a meal.

Storing—Use freezer bags and label what is inside for future use.

Reusing—Use stale bread to make croutons or breadcrumbs. Over-ripened fruit is perfect for smoothies.

Composting—This may seem particularly overwhelming or time consuming, but even doing a little on a small scale helps.

The View from the Street

As done during the past few summers, the LCPOA Management allowed for the relaxed enforcement of the 48-hour rule related to the parking at homes of boats, travel trailers and other types of recreational equipment, being aware that many residents have had the kids out of school and wanted to take advantage of this time to spend with family and friends using such equipment. Many residents have taken full advantage of this relaxed enforcement period, however now with summer coming to an end it is again time to start parking these types of equipment back in accordance with the <u>LCPOA Rules & Regulations</u>.

Compliance will return to a common practice of addressing any parking issues that are in violation of LCPOA Rules & Regulations **RR-06-20 PARKING**.

Some residents have a misunderstanding of the rules on parking, they believe that if their equipment is being move within a 48 hour period that they can keep the equipment at their home in view from the street and still be in compliance with the rules. This is not correct according to discussions with members on the LCPOA Board of Directors regarding this issue. It is the intent of the "48 hour parking rule" to allow those community members who store their trailers, watercraft, travel trailer, motor home, or other types of recreational equipment at a location away from their residence the time needed to prep their equipment for use, or clean their equipment after use **before returning the equipment to their storage area away from their residence**.

If residents were able to restart the 48-hour period by simply moving a trailer or motor home around the block and then bring it back to be parked at their residence in view from the street, there really wouldn't be the need for having a 48-hour parking rule.

So with the rule intent being made clear, any trailers, boats, motor homes or any other type of recreational equipment continually obsvered parked at a residence, are considered as being <u>stored</u> at the residence and must therefore be stored diffused from view of the street by means of being parked behind a six-foot (6') high Architectural Committee approved fence as stated in **RR-06-20 paragraph** (**F**). If residents do not have the space to appropriately store the equipment at their residence, then it will be necessary for them to secure storage at a storage facility, and if space is not available at LCPOA storage facility it is the responsibility of the resident to secure storage for their equipment elsewhere.

When parking along roadway easements, parking must be parallel and in the correct flow of traffic as stated in **RR-06-20 paragraph (H)**.

Also, parking on LCPOA property, (such as the open area property at the corner of Lake California Drive & River View Drive across from the airfield) without written authorization from the LCPOA is prohibited. This is covered in the LCPOA Declaration of Restrictions under Article 8.3 USE OF COMMON AR-EA which states in part that "nothing shall be altered, constructed, placed, kept, stored, parked, planted on, or removed from the Common Area without the prior written consent of the Board."

The reasoning behind parking restrictions is to preserve property values by regulating aesthetics. A number of cases have recognized the authority of controlling "visual blight" within a community. The cases deal with the right to restrict the parking of recreational vehicles, motor homes, trailers, boats, commercial vehicles, inoperable vehicles, and the like. California courts have ruled that ordinances enacted for aesthetic purposes are valid.

Thank you for parking your equipment in accordance with the LCPOA Governing Documents.

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
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Hello, Lake California Readers,

We hope to see you all down at the Club.




